4. First Aid Measures

First aid procedures

Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact Eye contact

lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Get medical attention if irritation

develops or persists.

Remove and isolate contaminated clothing and shoes. Wash off with warm water and Skin contact

soap. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists. For minor skin contact, avoid

spreading material on unaffected skin.

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Inhalation

Move to fresh air. Oxygen or artificial respiration if needed. Do not use mouth-to-mouth method if victim inhaled the substance. Induce artificial respiration with the aid of a pocket mask equipped with a one-way valve or other proper respiratory medical device. If symptoms persist, get medical attention.

Ingestion

If vomiting occurs naturally, have victim lean forward to reduce risk of aspiration. Do not use mouth-to-mouth method if victim ingested the substance. precautions for firefighters

In the event of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes. Wear full protective clothing, including helmet, self-contained positive pressure or pressure demand breathing apparatus, protective clothing and face mask. Containers should be cooled with water to prevent vapor pressure build up. For massive fire, use unmanned hose holders or monitor nozzles; if this is impossible, withdraw from area and let fire burn. Cool

containers with flooding quantities of water until well after fire is out.

6. Accidental Release Measures

Methods for containment

Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Stop leak if you can do so without risk. Move the cylinder to a safe and open area if the leak is irreparable. Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Use water spray to reduce vapors or divert vapor cloud drift. Prevent entry into waterways, sewers, basements or confined areas.

Methods for cleaning up

Should not be released into the environment. Use a non-combustible material like vermiculite, sand or earth to soak up the product and place into a container for later disposal.

Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean contaminated surface thoroughly. After removal flush contaminated area thoroughly with water.

Use only in area provided with appropriate exhaust ventilation. Do not use if spray button is missing or defective. Do not get this material in contact with eyes.
